The National Careers Service offers free advice to adults (19+) in England about careers, learning, and training. It helps people who are unemployed, over 50, or facing job changes.

Services are available by phone, in person, or online (Monday to Friday, 8am–8pm; Saturdays, 10am–5pm). Trained advisers provide one-on-one sessions to help with job applications, career planning, training, and funding options. The service also supports apprentices, older workers, and those with disabilities. It can assist with career changes, redundancy, upskilling, and finding jobs.

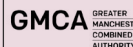

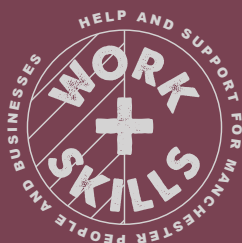
